

This township of 2,607 residents boasts kilometers of scenic waterfront property and the famous 1000 Islands Parkway. Front of Yonge is mainly rural with Mallorytown being its largest centre. Caintown, McIntosh Mills, Yonge Mills and Sherwood Springs are hamlets sprinkling the landscape. The area has a rich history. Mallorytown Landing is a St. Lawrence Islands National Park established by the Canadian Government in 1904. It was the first national park named east of the Canadian Rockies. The park includes more than 20 islands that are open to the public. Most are equipped with docks, trails, shelters and camping facilities.



Front of Yonge is also home to many unique campgrounds. Visitors and residents can also enjoy attractions such as Browns Bay Day Park overlooking the St. Lawrence River, the Mallorytown Coach House and Heritage Garden, the Ontario Waterfront Trail and the Road of Remembrance Site on County Road 5.
